Governor Sam Brownback appoints Eastborough Police Chief Daniel Bardezbain to the Kansas Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training.

Kansas Governor Sam Brownback has appointed Eastborough Police Chief Daniel Bardezbain to the Kansas Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training (KSCPOST). Bardezbain was appointed on February 13, 2012 to fill a vacancy left when Saint John Police Chief Vernon Ralston resigned in December of 2011.

Chief Bardezbain began his law enforcement career with the Sedgwick County Sheriff's Office on February 1, 1975 and retired at the rank of Major on September 15, 2006. He was hired as the Chief of Police for the City of Eastborough on September 14, 2009, a position he currently holds.

Chief Bardezbain is a graduate of Wichita State University where he earned a Bachelor of Science in Administration of Justice and a Masters degree in Public Administration. He is also a graduate of the 182nd Session of the FBI National Academy at Quantico, Virginia. In addition, he was selected as a member of the security teams for the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta, Georgia and the 2002 Winter Olympic Games in Salt Lake City, Utah.
