The public KS-CPOST Commission meeting was held via Microsoft Teams Meeting and was called to order at 9:00 am by Chair Brandon J. Johnson. Executive Director Gary Steed conducted a roll call of commissioners in attendance, along with KS-CPOST and KLETC staff in attendance listed above.

KS-CPOST Counsel, Michelle Meier, brought up for discussion four amendments to Senate Bill 247, asking for direction as to whether or not the commission would like testimony submitted on these amendments.

Motion 2021 M 03 was made to submit neutral written testimony on SB 247, specifically New Section 1(a), supporting mandatory central registry check; suggesting alternate language that the check should be before applicant is hired rather than interviewed; indicating that the language regarding “any other available registry” is vague. The motion passed unanimously.

Motion 2021 M 04 was made to submit neutral written testimony on SB 247, specifically New Section 1(b), indicating that this legislation allows agency heads to make determinations that are within CPOST purview and those decisions should be left with CPOST; pointing out the potential negative impact on information reporting from agencies to CPOST. The motion passed unanimously.

Motion 2021 M 05 was made by Commissioner Scheibler not to submit testimony regarding the amendment contained on page 2, lines 37 – 39 of SB 247. The motion passed unanimously.

Motion 2021 M 06 was made by Commissioner Scheibler to submit neutral written testimony on SB 247, specifically on page 4, lines 34 – 35, requesting that line 34 be amended to include the words “except as required for training purposes” after “in the line of duty”; requesting that “the firearms” in line 34 be amended to “a firearms”; requesting that the words “and administered” on line 35 be stricken. Chair Johnson seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Motion 2021 M 07 was made by Commissioner Herrig to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Scheibler seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
